To start this newsletter, we want to bring up this year's Carers Week! During the week, our whole team and partners were busy with organizing events, raising awareness of what it means to be a carer, and engaging with carers to have their voices be heard.

We hosted a variety of events, including the likes of having a relaxing day at St. Mellion's, where some of the carers had the chance to enjoy a relaxing day at the spa, while the male carers were able to play on the estate's golf courses.

Alongside that, we also organized an event for young adult carers to take part in an Escape Room at Truro, giving them opportunities to step away from their caring responsibilities and to be around those who are in similar circumstances.



We were involved at the Adult Safeguard Event in Newguay, where a variety of different groups, people and even some of our own team

had the chance to discuss what it means to be a carer, while raising awareness and understanding of what they go through on a daily basis.

disAbility Cornwall and the Carers Advice Team have been working hard during these last couple of months, by working with other carers and helping out our partners, including Promas with a couple of events and activities.

#### **Events and Activities w/ Promas**

Firstly, many of the Carers Advice Line attended three events that were hosted by Promas, to help and offer advice and support to carers, alongside what the Advice line has to offer.

They attended a trip to Seal Sanctuary in Gweek, alongide a day out to Trerice House and Gardens, and recently, a day in the sunshine at the Lost Gardens of Heligan.

## **Carer Cards for Young Carers**

Barnardo's and disAbility Cornwall are excited to announced that they will be rolling out Young Carers Cards. Both partners have been hard at work, promoting a professional understanding and poignancy of showing a card, alongside raising awareness of what it means to be a young carer at schools.

The main benefits of having a card includes:

- To raise awareness of their responsibilities and to give formal recognition of their role as a carer.
- To discreetly let people know about their caring responsibilities without having to share personal details

over and over.

• To give confidence to ask for help or understanding from professionals like teachers, doctors and pharmacists.
